

Dianne Ashlock

Ms. Ashlock's career with the Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) has spanned 29 years. Most of that time was spent with the Community Corrections Division where I started as a Community Corrections Officer. In addition, to managing a caseload, her responsibilities included caseload assignment (this work interfaced with the records department) and trainer for new initiatives and new legislation enacted.

After approximately 11 years of working in the field, Ms. Ashlock was promoted to a headquarters position with statewide responsibility related to sex offender registration. Later, she became the manager of the unit and again participated in legislative implementation and training of staff related to issues of sex offender registration. This position provided her the opportunity to be assigned to a statewide multi-agency Sex Offender Policy Group that evaluated current laws and made recommendations for sentencing updates related to sex offenders.

Ms. Ashlock later returned to the Community Corrections Division as a Regional Administrator with operational responsibilities to include staffing, statewide implementation of legislation and division decisions related to violator issues and offender programming. She held this position for 7 years.

In March 2016, Ms. Ashlock was appointed as the agency's Records Director. As accurate offender records establishes the agency's jurisdiction to confine or supervise individuals, she continues to work collaboratively with DOC operations and the court systems to ensure that DOC is appropriately carrying out the court ordered sentence. Additionally, she works to ensure that the records department has the appropriate resources to accomplish this work.
