

Elizabeth Gill, J.D.

Prior to her election in 2006, Judge Elizabeth Gill had 18 years of litigation experience. Her practice was limited exclusively to family law matters. Born and raised in the Columbus Ohio area, she is a graduate of The Ohio State University Moritz College of Law.

Judge Gill has been Franklin County Juvenile Court's Lead Juvenile Judge since January 2012.

During her time on the bench, Judge Gill was appointed to the Commission on the Rules of Practice and Procedure by the Supreme Court of Ohio and served for two consecutive three-year terms. She currently serves as Chair for the Juvenile Justice Sub-committee for the Supreme Court of Ohio's Advisory Committee on Children & Families and on the Law Advisory Committee for the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges. She is a member of the Columbus Bar Association, the Ohio Association of Domestic Judges, the Ohio Association of Juvenile Court Judges, the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges and the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts. She previously served as a member of the Executive Committee for District 4 of the Ohio Association of Juvenile Court Judges.

Volunteer efforts include past two-term board member for Alvis House, being a mentor in the Big Brothers & Big Sisters and Lawyer to Lawyer Mentoring programs, volunteer moot court Judge, and in the Columbus Public Schools working directly with truant children and their families.

In 2011 she was the recipient of the George E. Tyack Award for Judicial Excellence. In 2013 she was named a Henry Toll Fellow with the Counsel for State Governments. In 2017 she received the Ohio Association of Juvenile Court Judges' Distinguished Service Award.
