

**Cecelia Klingele, J.D.**

Cecelia Klingele received her J.D. from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 2005 and served as a law clerk to Chief Judge Barbara B. Crabb of the United States District Court for the Western District of Wisconsin, Judge Susan H. Black of the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, and Associate Justice John Paul Stevens of the United States Supreme Court. She returned to the University of Wisconsin in 2009 as a visiting assistant professor, and has been a permanent faculty member since 2011.

Professor Klingele's academic research focuses on criminal justice administration, with an emphasis on community supervision of those on conditional release. She has served as Associate Reporter for the American Law Institute's Model Penal Code: Sentencing revision, External Co-Director of the University of Minnesota Robina Institute's Sentencing Law & Policy Program, and past co-chair of the Academic Committee of the American Bar Association's Criminal Justice Section. She teaches courses in criminal law, Constitutional criminal procedure, policing, and sentencing and corrections. In addition to her teaching and research, Professor Klingele is a faculty associate of the Frank J. Remington Center, the La Follette School of Public Affairs, and the Institute for Research on Poverty. Professor Klingele and her husband live in Madison. They have two grown children, and seven more at home who ensure life is never boring.
